

FACT SHEET

Delaware County Victim Assistance Center is a private non-profit agency founded as Women Against Rape in 1974. Delco Victim Assistance addresses the effects of trauma on the community and on the individual. We empower and give voice to those who have experienced trauma through sexual assault and other serious crimes. We promote healing and justice by providing accompaniment and advocacy, and we strive to prevent sexual violence through education and awareness. We hold ourselves to the values of respect, empathy, empowerment, dependability, and excellence in service in every aspect of our work and relationships. Our vision is to be a model victims services organization, striving for excellence in all efforts, collaborating to inclusively serve the community to be free of sexual assault and other victimization, through education, social justice, healing, and empowerment.

Services – all services are confidential and free of charge

- <u>24-hour hotline</u> accesses staff with specialized training in crisis intervention and counseling of victims of sexual assault. Victims may receive services at either the time of the assault or any time afterward -- even years later.
- <u>Accompaniment Services</u> are available 24 hours a day by Counselor/Advocates. Accompaniment
 may be to hospitals, police stations, and all court proceedings arising out of the rape, assault, or
 other serious crime.
- <u>Counseling Services</u> offer supportive, problem-solving counseling to victims, their families, and significant others, individually or in support groups.
- <u>Assistance with Crime Victims Compensation</u>, to ease the financial impact placed on victims because of the crime.
- <u>Civil Legal Services</u> are provided by staff attorneys to victims of sexual assault, dating violence, stalking, or other serious crimes.
- <u>Education, Outreach, and Awareness</u> training programs are provided at schools (pre-kindergarten through high school), colleges and technical schools, and to professional and community groups.

Departments and Staffing

- Administration: Executive Director, Assistant Executive Director, Fiscal Manager, Office Manager
- <u>Sexual Assault</u>: Director, four Counselor/Advocates
- <u>Crime Victims Services</u>: Director, three Counselor/Advocates, one Victim Advocate police department liaison
- <u>Therapy</u>: two credentialed Therapists
- <u>Crime Victims Law Project</u>: Director, two Staff Attorneys
- <u>Prevention Education</u>: Director, two Educators

Note: All staff have completed 40-hour Sexual Assault Counselor training.

Governance

Members of the Board of Directors are elected for 3-year terms, with eligibility for reelection. Members of the Board:

- serve on at least one committee
- make a personal financial contribution annually

- are ambassadors for the organization enthusiastic, knowledgeable, and connected to the community
- govern with a mindset that is both critical and visionary
